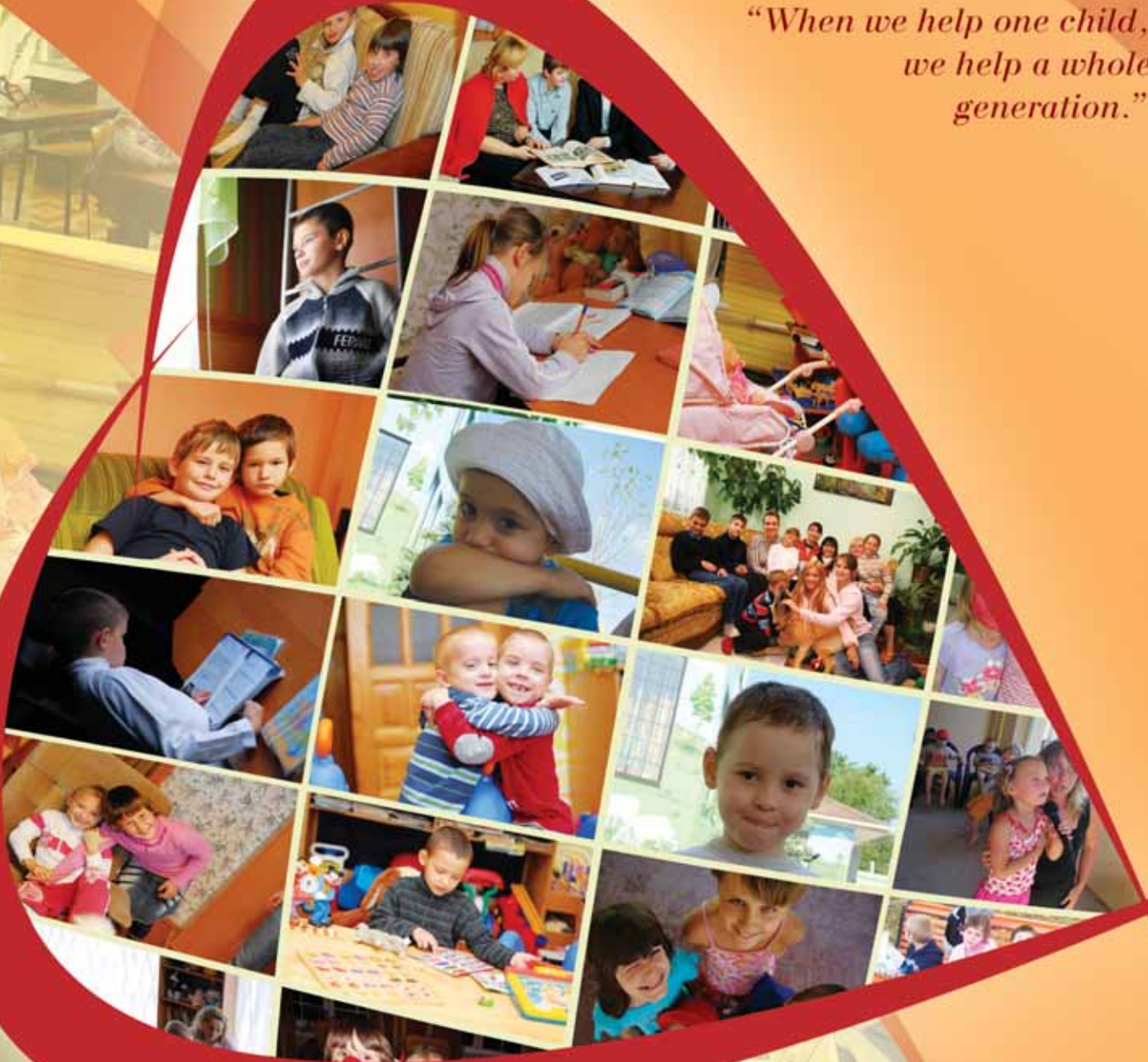

Father's House International Charity Foundation started its activities in 1996, providing help to street children, orphans and children left without parental care. During this time, hundreds of children were taken from the streets, underwent rehabilitation, received an education and are living in families.

Father's House ICF is a charitable, non-profit, non-government and non-political organization working on Christian ethic and moral principles.

Mission:

To save the generation of abandoned children and orphans and to prepare them for ministry to the Lord and people, proclaiming Good News by word and deed.

Vision:

We believe that with the joint **efforts of churches, charity, public organizations and governmental structures**, we can solve the problem of child homelessness and **neglect by offering thousands of children loving and caring families**.



Basic goals:

- prevention of homeless children;
- counseling for children and their parents;
- prevention of early abandonment;
- rehabilitation of children who are homeless and at risk;
- rehabilitation of parents and placement of children back to rehabilitated families;
- promotion of national adoption and placing children in new families;
- support of adoptive and foster families, children's homes;
- support for students graduated from orphanages and other children's institutions;
- share and teach our model of success in working with children to others.

Spiritual reasons which affect the plight of orphanhood:

- the lack of faith in God and parents not taking responsibility for their own children before Him;
- destruction of family values during many generations;
- unfavorable influence of television in forming children's world-view;
- Killing children in mother's womb – Abortion;
- indifference of society to the future of the rising generation of children.

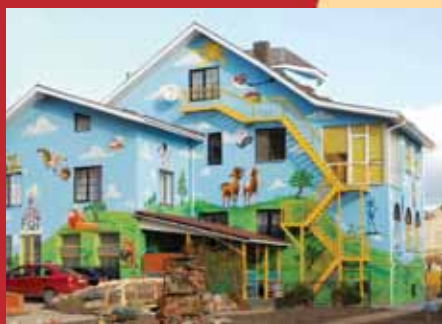
Our work is directed to help:

- street children;
- orphans;
- children left without parental care;
- children from crisis families.



The work of **Father's House** and its leaders was reputedly honored with governmental awards, including President's "Order of Merit" III degree (2003), "Order of Merit" II degree (2008), Medal "For work and perseverance" (2008), Medal for "Conscious Parenthood" from the Ministry of family youth and sport affairs of Ukraine (2007), "Order of Honor" III degree from "Salvation" church (2008); order for "Patriotism" from International Academy Rating of popularity and quality "Golden Fortune" (2003).

Center of Social Care for Children



Centre of Social Care for Children provides rehabilitation for street children, orphans and children left without parental care. Every year the **Center** takes a group of children found in difficult life conditions and helps them. To focus on children who need the most help, the Centre team works with crisis families, in governmental shelters and on the streets, tightly cooperating with other partner organizations.

The new stage of the child's life starts at **Treasure Island**. Treasure Island — is a summer camp with a program based on “pedagogics of adventures” and gives children a chance, with the help of experienced caregivers, to adapt to a new way of life, and to gain necessary skills for the future. For eight years the camp took place on an actual island in Kyiv, and since 2008 it moved to the city of Kerch in Crimea. The number of children at the camp is up to 25. In an atmosphere of adventure, interesting tasks and activities, step by step children leave their negative past and bad habits behind. They start making new friends, helping each other and the adults, learning to manage their emotions and gain important skills. By the end of August some children return to their biological families or to relatives, and the rest of the children are taken to live at the Center of Social Care for Children.



Center of Social Care for Children is situated in Petrivske village, Kiev region. 16 children undergo further complex (spiritual, medical, educational, social and psychological) rehabilitation during a period of 9 months. The task of this rehabilitation is to prepare the child to come back to their rehabilitated, biological family or for living in a family group in **My Family** Care Center. For each child, caregivers develop an individual program of development, considering their strengths and weaknesses and also the child's history. At the same time an active legal

investigation is developed to determine the child's legal status, protection of their property, if any and other rights are conducted.

During 2008 Center of Social Care for Children has achieved the following:

- **19** children underwent the program of rehabilitation at Treasure Island summer camp in Kerch town;
- **9** new children were taken to the Center;
- **5** children were placed into My Family Care Center;
- **4** children returned to biological families or relatives;
- in total, during the year 2008 there were **24** children in the Center;
- all the children went through medical examinations, **4** children had surgeries, **13** children had complex dentist treatment, **7** children had regular lessons with speech therapist;
- all the children of school age attend local school, and **3** of them take individual lessons;
- new furniture and equipment were purchased, the roof repaired, exterior walls were painted, facade decoration and decorative works in **three** rooms have been completed;
- speed ramps have been placed in Petrovskogo str. nearby the building of the Center of Social Care.



“My name is Ira. I'm 8 years old. I came to the Father's House in summer 2008. My parents had no place to live. Often, we were staying overnight under the open sky. They were drinking alcohol. I had no documents at all. When all the children of my age went to school, I had no chance to go there, though I wanted it so much. No one taught me to write or read.

I really liked to be at Father's House. I am studying here. For the first time in my life I have my own bed, desk, toys, enough food and clothes. I mostly like that I'm loved and respected here. I feel safe. In December I met a family, and I really liked them. We became friends and this family decided to adopt me. Very soon all the paperwork will be done and I will go from “Father's House” to a new home with loving parents!”

“My Family” Care Centre

For many years “My Family” Care Centre has yielded excellent results in the work with orphans and children at risk by applying the practical example of the value of a family. By demonstrating Christian principles within the confines of the family unit, the children are taught how to live accordingly and they learn to apply them in their own future families. The Family Care program began as a part the Center of Social Care for Children in 2004. In September 2008 it was officially registered as a charity organization — “My Family” Care Centre.

In 2002, a separate building with apartments was constructed. This building was built to house six family units. These family units consist of one couple (caregiver-parents) and eight children. The caregiver-father works outside the program and the caregiver-mother takes care of the children and the home. Also, for 3-4



hours every day an assistant caregiver comes to help the caregiver-mother with her daily chores and children’s homework from school. Every apartment is fully equipped and has a cozy home environment. This is to insure the development of a harmonious, healthy family lifestyle. Children stay here until they are adopted or they start their own independent life.

By observing the relationships between mother and father, brothers and sisters, the children are taught the value of the family and their responsibility. Children are taught financial responsibility within the family by learning how to keep to a budget and spend money wisely.

The caregiver-parents prepare the children emotionally for adoption in case it arises. Together with the children they also develop a plan for their future educational goals and professional career choices.

During the year 2008 the following work was accomplished by the Center:

- 7 new children were taken to the Center;
- 7 children adopted and 2 given to foster families;
- 2 children returned to biological families;
- 8 children have started independent life;
- 28 children attended school and 8 — high and professional training schools;
- there were total of 47 children in the Center during the year;
- children have been on 8 trips in Ukraine and abroad;
- 3 family-group apartments repaired.



“Children in our family are 12-16 years old. They are all different and each of them comes from different experiences. They all have the same dream in common. They dream of their own family, where they will be loved and protected. Most of them have parents, but their rights have been terminated and they are not interested in their children’s lives. This hurts the children even more than if they would have no parents at all. Some of the children experienced abuse from their own parents. They have wounds from people who were the closest to them. They need time to heal.

Children in our family are the best in the world. God gave us patience, strength, wisdom, respect and love for them. We had different situations, and God has always given us wisdom to find the answer. Through this time with the children they became more obedient and open with us. They can sincerely express their feelings, positive as well as negative. Children are sharing their thoughts and dreams with us. They have started to study much better, to think more logical, read more and help each other in their studies. But the most important is that they got to know about God. They read the Bible, pray and minister at church with their gifts. They sing and take part in drama.

Recently, we had a wonderful event in our family. Two brothers Dima and Olexiy 13 and 14 years old were adopted. Now they have a loving mother, father and three sisters. We thank God for a chance to minister to these children and help them to make their dream come true.”

Youth program

The Youth Program works as a part of “My Family” Care Center. The main goal of this program is to prepare older children to enter independent life. The participants are children older than 16 years old. They are high school or college students who were not adopted while staying at “My Family” Care Centre. A couple, only 10-15 years older than the children is the caregivers or mentors. They live together with the children in one of the Centre’s apartments. There are up to eight teenagers in a unit.



In this program young people are learning the basic principles of independent living. Some of these skills include learning to plan and keep a daily budget, pay bills, buy food, pay for transport and save. They are taught to keep their rooms clean and in order and they learn to plan their time for the day to day events.

At the same time the mentors provide a comfortable, stable and orderly environment. They help with conflict resolution, and they offer advice to every young person individually as to what school to attend and future career goals.

Together with the young people the mentors organize their free time. They go to trips to the theatre, exhibitions, concerts, picnics and other events.

The young people’s stay in the program is not-limited by time, but until the moment when they are ready to begin their adult lives.

Here in the Youth Program, a young person is prepared and equipped with all the necessary skills to live a productive, independent life.

Program of support for students who graduate from the children’s institutions



This program allows children who have graduated from different children’s institutions to get an education and find a job according to their talents and aspirations. Besides financial support, the program offers participants regular interaction and support from the program coordinators.

Results for year 2008:

- **54** orphan students received regular financial support, among them **18** — in Kyiv, **12** in Maiupol and **24** — in Crimea;
- **16** study in High Schools, **19** in Technical vocational schools and colleges and **20** in trade schools.

“My name is Misha and I’m 19. I’m the 4th year student of Industrial economical college, majoring in “Electronic Machines”. I study very well; I especially like “Economics and Law”. At the same time that I study I work in a Computer Company. It helps me to get practical skills in programming. I have a prospective of getting a job in my profession. My dream is to become a good specialist and to be useful for my country. My country will be proud of me.”

New Family Adoption Program

New Family Program's vision is to provide each child an opportunity to be raised in a family. We believe the family is the most effective form of care for children and the most natural environment where children can develop their gifts and talents.

The program workers provide information and counseling regarding the different aspects of adoption to prospective adoptive parents who want and can give hope and a future to an orphan child. The effective assessment of the adoptive family is a very important task of the program.

This system helps the adoptive family in their process, before, during and after the adoption is completed. It should be considered a good model to develop nationally.

The program publishes and distributes different educational materials, practical booklets and documentary videos. They also assist in training and offer seminars and conferences on adoption.



In 2008 the adoption program made progress in following:

- **64** consultations to adoptive parents;
- **5 000** copies of the second edition of “Adoption: step by step” book were published;
- **5908** users have registered on the internet website;
- participated in recording of **2** TV programs and **1** radio program.

Children's Arts



Among positive changes in the lives of the children at **Father's House** is their desire to develop their creative gifts. They learn to play music, to act in the theatre, and to create with their own hands different objects from natural and synthetic materials. To satisfy these children's needs and to assist their all-around development these wonderful creative groups were developed. Children can go to a theatre studio, sing in a vocal music group and do different hand-made articles in the art studio. Since very young they learn to serve others and to fill their life with positive emotions.

“Singing Hearts” — is a vocal music group, with one main credo — to create, sing and serve disabled children, children at orphanages, boarding schools, teenagers in specialized prisons, poor people and the elderly.

In 2008 singing group:

- took part in the charity event “Donate blood — save a life”;
- participated in a charity concert organized by “Linda Fonds” in Netherlands;
- performed in the anniversary of “S’Einladele” in Germany;
- organized actions to support the disabled and cerebral palsy children.



The theatre studio **“Dialogue”** has a goal to develop a child's creative potential through acting and to minister to others with their performances. At the studio, the children learn the actor's art, specific acting techniques, and skills for getting the feel of a role. At the same time the children learn self control and discipline.

In 2008 “Dialogue” theatre studio has done following:

- taken part in a theatre festival in Lviv;
- participated in a charity event for poor elderly people;
- organized the action of support for poor families in Gaivoron and Koziatyn towns;
- at Christmas they performed the Christmas play in schools, governmental and private institutions.



Art studio

The art studio is intended not just to teach children to create art, but to develop their talents, and also to dream of their future by seeing the examples of small pieces of fabric or material becoming a masterpiece. They can see this analogy in their own life with time something abandoned can become a masterpiece that the whole country will be proud of.



“My name is Marina. I'm in the 8th grade, I love to sing, and dance. I attend the theater studio. Together with “Singing Hearts” music group, I take part in performing all over Ukraine and in many other countries. With theater performances we have visited a lot of governmental, charity organizations, and churches of Ukraine. We were openly welcomed everywhere.

I especially liked our performance in the USA. People who came to the concert were so kind, they listened, sang with us, supported us, and even cried. I liked those open hearts. They received us in their homes, as the dearest and most honored guests. They fed us and blessed us. When we were leaving, they said good bye with tears in their eyes!”

Pilgrim's Hope Children's Recreation Centre

Pilgrim's Hope organizes fun-filled, recreational activities such as camping, and sporting events for the children and youth from **Father's House** and other children's programs of different regions in Ukraine.

These excursions and physical activities develop a positive world-view which enables the child to foster a healthy view of others and their own personal growth.

Two times a year the children make a walking trip to Crimea and the Carpathian mountains. During this trip, the children are learning to overcome difficulties, make responsible decisions, set goals and attempt to reach for them. They are expanding their outlook on life. This gives them a wonderful opportunity to learn and watch the beauty in everything surrounding us and to thank God for that.

Through the program, we have seen that children from difficult backgrounds leave their bad habits behind and develop new positive character traits, which will help them live a strong, courageous and successful independent life.

During the last four years two houses for camps and recreation in Crimea have been repaired and equipped.



In 2008 Pilgrim's Hope program has done the following:

- **6** children and adults have been to a winter mountain hiking trip on the Smotrych mountain (1820m) in Carpathians;
- **12** children and adults have attended a summer mountain hiking trip in the Chornogory mountain range in the Carpathians mountains;
- **358** children and adults have vacationed at the house in Shtormove;
- **78** children and adults spent a summer period at a house in Kerch town.

"I lived at Father's House for six years. Once, Uncle Igor told us about a mountain hiking trip and a chance for us to be there. I really wanted to take part in it. In a few weeks, we started to gather the team and we held meetings, and started to plan what would we needed for the trip. We studied the maps, determined how much food we needed for the whole group, and what kind of clothes, shoes, and equipment we should take.

Then the time came, but it wasn't that easy. After the first walking trip to the mountain, I felt so tired and I couldn't walk any further. I was going to stay there and go no where. But my friends were there, some teenagers like me, and I was ashamed to stay. Uncle Igor gathered us and said: "Here, at this point, I can let you go back to the camp. It's going to be very difficult to go further. You need to make a decision: to go further or to go back to the camp". I had tears in my eyes, and pain in my feet, the backpack was so heavy, but I decided to keep on walking, and not to give up. We prayed to God to give us strength and patience. And He helped us. We got a renewed strength and we were getting higher and higher. And the nature around us was so beautiful: blue sky, nice flowers, trees and the most important - mountains! We enjoyed everything. We took pictures and had fun! Never in our lives had we seen such beauty. All because we got to the top, taking the effort to struggle with tiredness! I will apply this principle in my life.

This mountain hiking trip changed my life. I think that now I can do much more. I really liked it, it was cool. We were helping each other and supporting one another. We were eating together and overcoming our weaknesses.

I thank God for this trip. I will remember it for the rest of my life."

International Leadership and Development Centre



Father's House co-founded International Leadership and Development Center with the goal to provide competency - based training and share best practices in working with children in Ukraine with other organizations that deal with children in crisis. The Center promotes trainings, seminars and other educational events. Our main objective is to provide support by publishing and distributing books, study materials, and to develop a partnership between different organizations



working within the sphere of children's welfare.

For the period of 2008 the following was accomplished:

- the International Leadership and Development Center social organization was officially registered;
- **3** trainings on adoption and **4** on social work with children were held for **108** specialists of governmental and social services from all regions of Ukraine;
- training for Father's House workers was held;
- **400** copies of "Social-psychological work with families and children in crisis" ("Field Guide to Child Welfare") volume I was distributed;
- **3 000** copies of **6** booklets of "Effective parenthood step by step" were published;
- a trip of professionals who work with children from the USA was organized and **2** conferences for key-workers of governmental services is conducted.



Counseling Department

The work of the Counseling Department is directed to renew the spiritual and emotional condition of the children who suffer from deep psychological traumas. Among the problems children struggle with are low self-confidence, a deep sense of unimportance, anger, fear, un-forgiveness towards their parents and many others.

The process of counseling itself is based on the principles — to receive a child with unconditional love, to teach her or him to accept help for spiritual and emotional problems. As the result of this work, children stop living in their past and concentrate on a new life for their future. They now can have a chance to experience this revival in a personal way and throughout all spheres of their lives, to receive God's blessing and achieve success.

The Counseling Department for the year 2008 has done the following:

- more than **500** counseling sessions were provided to **45** orphans and children left without parental care;
- **160** counseling sessions were provided to **50** parents and children from families having conflicts;
- **6** training seminars for caregivers at Father's House;
- more than **50** counseling sessions given by phone;
- **20** children met their parents;
- **2** suicide preventions;
- **6** children counseled before adoption;
- **7** children helped from nightmares and 1 from sleepwalking;
- **10** children were helped with low self-confidence and abandonment issues.

"Andriy is a teenage boy who was suffering from bed-wetting. During the counseling session it was revealed that the root of this problem was in his past. His mother often beat him hard. Andriy opened up in counseling. He told the counselor of his pain and worries. A real miracle happened, when by our prayer God gave him strength to forgive his mother and He has healed from his bed-wetting".*

Humanitarian Aid Program "Messenger of Peace"

Messenger of Peace program works not only to meet the needs of children at Father's House centers but also to provide charity to thousands of orphans, widows, disabled people, single mothers, and others. Some of this aid is in the form of clothes and shoes for different seasons for children and adults, furniture, kitchen and sport equipment, food, and different hygiene supplies.

As a result of cooperating with different charity organizations all over Ukraine and abroad, **Messenger of Peace** has developed strong partnerships with other agencies that really care, support, and help the vulnerable and defenseless people of the world.



Thanks to resources we have in the program, we teach our children this principle: "It's more blessed to give than to receive", inviting them to take part in the program's projects.



For the year 2008 the Peace Messenger accomplished the following:

- received and distributed **84** tons of humanitarian aid;
- **46** organizations from different regions of Ukraine including governmental institutions, children's institutions, hospitals, charity organizations, received **56,2** tons of aid;
- **6044** children received Christmas presents;
- **9,2** tones of humanitarian aid directed to people suffered from flood in Western Ukraine;
- **56** families displaced by a flood received financial support;
- more than **10,000** orphans, disabled persons, families with many children, retirees and chronically sick people were provided with humanitarian aid.

"During our trip to the Carpathians, we had a goal to provide support to people suffering from flood damage. We saw a lot of people's pain, tears, and ruins. Walking from house to house, we all talked to people, consoled them, and encouraged them. We helped them with clothes, shoes, household items, food, and other things.

When we visited one house, we met a family - Frolyak. This family consisted of a husband, wife, and two children who lived in a very small house. The father works in a village and the mother is unemployed.

They told us about their life. This family had a big need providing gas to the house. To earn this kind of money in this place was very difficult. They turned to different people and places for help, but no one replied. Not losing their hope, they were asking God to help them, and He did.

When we heard this story we made a decision to help this family with the installing of the gas supply.

Since autumn 2008, after living many years in a cold small hut, the family enjoys warmth in their house.

We are sure they are thankful to God for that!"

Bethel Complex of Social Care and Protection in Gorbovichi village



Father's House together with Kyivo-Svyatoshynskiy Regional Government has developed **Bethel** project which envisions a number of programs to provide effective and solid support to children and adults from unprotected layers of society.

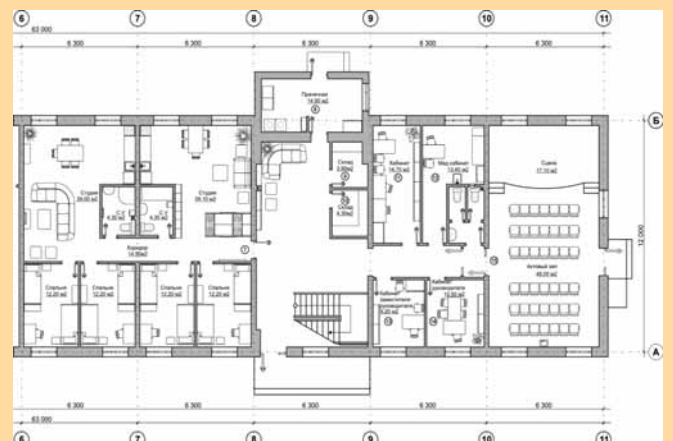


The goals of Bethel Complex of Social Care and Protection are:

- creation of favorable condition for rehabilitation of children at risk;
- to provide support to pregnant women and women with babies in difficult life conditions with a goal to prevent abortion and early abandonment;
- to provide support to orphans and children left without parental care who have graduated from different children's institutions;
- to develop recreational summer camps for children from underprivileged and poor families.

To accomplish this project in 2008 the following goals have been achieved:

- received "Gorbovytska Sich" recreation camp in Gorbovichi village, Kiev oblast;
- project design of the main building reconstruction;
- tearing down of inner walls, service supply, windows and doors, placed the holes for installing new windows and doors;
- project analysis of water supply, heating and ventilation system planned.



Expected results from Bethel Complex of Social Care and Protection

Farm Care Centre

The goal of this center is to provide rehabilitation based on interaction with animals in a farm setting. The work is open for children from all areas — children's houses, foster families, orphanages, rehabilitation centers, at risk families, poor families, and ordinary families. The Farm Care Center is designed to operate during the whole year. The course of therapy and recreation will serve 15–20 children at the same. The course will take 14 to 21 days. There are no other programs like this one in Ukraine at the moment.

Mother & Child Centre

The Center will provide support to pregnant women and woman with babies in difficult life conditions with the goal of preventing abortions and baby abandonment. Aid will be given to pregnant women, including teenage-girls with babies, homeless pregnant women, and woman with babies in difficult life conditions or crisis situations. The Center will be designed for the simultaneous living of up to 18 women and 12 children, who will live in home-like conditions.



Youth Centre Dormitory

The Youth Center Dormitory will provide its services to children who have graduated from governmental and private children's institutions that don't have their own place to live, or that were found in difficult life conditions. Here young people will be able to live in flats equipped with everything necessarily for independent living. 30 children can live at the same time in the dormitory.



Rehabilitation Centre for Children at Risk

The Centre will provide complex (psychological, educational, physical and social) rehabilitation to children at risk. There will be living quarters for homeless children, children who have suffered from abuse, orphans and children left without parental care. The building of The Centre is designed for simultaneous living of 18 children, in conditions that resemble closely to living in a family. The program of rehabilitation will take place from September until May.

Summer Camp

The Summer Camp will provide recreational activities for children of Kyivo-Svyatoshynskiy district. It will be serving children of at risks families, poor families, foster care children and children affected by the explosion in Chernobyl. The camp is designed for three terms 70-100 children each.



Family-Type Children's House in Radomyshl City



The ultimate goal of **Father's House** is to place each child in a family. In spite of the idea that the best way to help each child is through adoption, it is also very important to develop other forms of family care like foster families and family-type children's houses. In the summer of 2008 **Father's House** decided to open a family-type children's house in Radomyshl city, Zhytomir region.

When the building will be finished and a group of 10 children with caregiver-parents will move in and decorate the house.

Caregiver-parents in this family-type house are a couple who used to work at "My Family" Care Center who decided to devote their lives to the future of these children's lives.



Living Stream Private Christian School



In 2008, **Father's House** began working on developing a private Christian school. This project's goal is to offer an alternative to government-run schools by establishing a school based on Christian principles. The classes and the school format will be structured in order to insure the highest quality of education and all-round child's development. After graduation all the children will receive an official government diploma.

Expected results from Living Stream school activity:

- **high level of academic education in accordance** with official government standards subjects;
- **individual approach** to the children;
- **integration of Biblical truths** and Christian world-view in all school subjects;
- **education of children as honest people with a sense of self-worth.**
